Dear Parishioners,

Today is the 33rd Sunday in ordinary time, the penultimate Sunday of the liturgical year. The readings have a certain sense of tension and expectation.

Gradually, the truth emerges from them about the ultimate destiny of the world and man's fate foreseen by God. The end of the liturgical year is meant to remind us of our vocation to eternity and the transience and fragility of this world in which we live.

Today's readings, both from the Book of the Prophet Daniel and the Gospel of St. Mark, reveal an apocalyptic vision of a certain end that is determined by God's Providence. The history of the world, so muddled and tragic, is - despite our frequent doubts - led by God towards the ultimate goal, towards the appearance of His kingdom.

In addition to a warning, there is also an incentive for a holy life based on justice and love, to live in humility and simplicity in service to God and neighbor, and in praising God for the simplest manifestations of His presence. In choosing this road, we will not be afraid of the future. We will go into eternity with courage, as if for the promised reward, for meeting with the beloved person - because it will indeed be the same. The announcement of judgment also means that there is hope that God will accept the unjustly suffering. Sometimes, when we spread our hands helplessly, when our eyes are filled with tears, and our fist is clenched in anger, it is the memory of God's righteousness, the end of evil set by God, that brings us relief and hope.

Jesus in today's Gospel invites us to be vigilant, to read his signs in a skillful manner. In the analogy, as we observe the world of creatures and nature, we draw conclusions about the time of harvest, the change of seasons; we observe the events similarly taking place in the world. A Christian who bases his life on God

finds strength in an intimate relationship with God in prayer, in listening to His Word, in feeding on the Holy Eucharist, all by which he will be able to discern the true coming of the Lord. He will be able to reject false prophecies, sometimes having the appearance of truth, and focus on this only and real coming, longingly awaited for. However, Christ himself assures us that this moment will always remain a mystery.

Why do we "have to" go to Mass? - Part 3 This week let's look at what are some...

MORE GOOD REASONS TO GO TO MASS:

- People need our prayers. We can pray for other people anytime, but when we pray for others during Mass, we pray in a special way. It doesn't matter if the other people are separated from us by distance or death. The Mass brings us together in the Body of Christ, and we become the communion of saints. It is part of the cosmic dimension of the Mass that unites heaven and earth by reaching across time and space.
- We need to stand up for what we believe. Being a follower of Jesus is counter-cultural. At every Mass, we have the opportunity to stand up and proclaim what we believe publicly. We admit that we believe in God, in Jesus, in the Holy Spirit, in the Catholic Church, in the communion of saints, in the forgiveness of sins, an in life after death. It is a powerful statement of allegiance and an opportunity to recommit ourselves.
- we need to acknowledge that we make mistakes. At every Mass, we have the opportunity to review the past week. We admit that we have sinned in thought, in word, in deed, in what we have done and what we have failed to do. We seek forgiveness, and we are assured that God still loves us. Before we receive Communion, we admit that we are not worthy and ask God to heal us. Going to Mass helps us to strengthen our commitment to live moral lives.

- We need ritual in our lives. Mass is a ritual, which means that through the repetition of prayers, movements, and the changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, we are formed, disciplined, and consoled. The "sameness" of the Mass carries us along the spiritual journey—even when we don't "feel" like praying. The "sameness" of the ritual allows us to be transformed on a soul level, even if we are unaware of what is happening.
- We need to experience something bigger than ourselves. When we go to Mass, we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus. When we offer our ordinary lives to God through Jesus, we enter into God's great plan for the world. We are strengthened by the Gospel message to all people. The Mass gives meaning and purpose to our lives. It gives us a sense of destiny and offers the kind of peace that the world cannot give. It helps us develop a sense of wonder and awe. It helps us to see that there is something bigger than ourselves.

- Sister House (a Catholic run homeless women's shelter in Chicago)



Children's Liturgy of the Word

Drodzy Parafianie,

Trzydziesta trzecia niedziela zwykła, to przedostatnia niedziela roku liturgicznego. W czytaniach mszalnych w tych dniach daje się odczuć pewne napięcie, oczekiwanie. Stopniowo wyłania się z nich prawda

o przewidzianym przez Boga ostatecznym losie świata i człowieka. Schylek roku liturgicznego ma nam przypominać o naszym powołaniu do wieczności, o przemijalności i kruchości tego świata w którym żyjemy.

Dzisiejsze czytania, zarówno z Księgi Daniela, jak i z Ewangelii wg św. Marka kreśląc apokaliptyczne wizje pewnego końca, chcą nam powiedzieć, że istnieje kres wyznaczony przez Bożą Opatrzność. Dzieje świata, tak bardzo zagmatwane i tragiczne, są – mimo naszych częstych wątpliwości – prowadzone przez Boga ku ostatecznemu celowi, ku pojawieniu się Jego królestwa.

Ale to słowo, oprócz wymiaru pewnej przestrogi, jest również zachętą do świętego życia, opartego o sprawiedliwość i miłość, o przeżywanie swojej codzienności w pokorze i prostocie, w służbie Bogu i bliźnim, w uwielbieniu Boga za najprostsze przejawy Jego obecności. Żyjąc w ten sposób, nie będziemy lękali się przyszłości, będziemy szli ku wieczności z odwagą, jak po obiecaną nagrodę, jak na spotkanie z najukochańszą osobą – bo tak też w istocie będzie. Zapowiedź sprawiedliwego sądu to również nadzieja na to, że Bóg ujmie się za wszystkimi, którzy niesprawiedliwie cierpią. Czasem, gdy bezradnie rozkładamy ręce, gdy oczy zroszone są łzami, gdy w gniewie zaciska się nasza pięść, bo tak reagujemy, to właśnie pamięć o Bożej sprawiedliwości, o tym, że jest kres zła wyznaczony przez Boga i również Jemu znany jest kres złoczyńców, przynosi nam ulgę i nadzieję.

Pan Jezus w dzisiejszej Ewangelii zachęca nas do czujności, do umiejętnego odczytywania znaków Jego nadejścia. Z jednej strony Pan Jezus mówi, że tak jak obserwujemy świat stworzeń, przyrody i na tej podstawie wyciągamy wnioski o czasie plonu, zbioru owoców, zmianie pory roku, to podobnie mamy obserwować wydarzenia, jakie dokonują się na świecie. Chrześcijanin, który opiera swoje życie na Bogu, znajduje siłę w intymnej relacji z Bogiem na modlitwie, w słuchaniu jego Słowa, w karmieniu się Najświętszą Eucharystią, będzie umiał rozeznać prawdziwe nadejście Pana. Będzie potrafił odrzucić fałszywe proroctwa, mające czasem

pozory prawdy, i skupić się na tym jedynym przyjściu, na które przecież z utęsknieniem czeka. A z drugiej strony sam Chrystus zapewnia, że ten moment pozostanie na zawsze tajemnicą.

Z tej dzisiejszej refleksji wypływa dla nas perspektywa pełna nadziei, że jest przygotowane każdemu z nas wieczne szczęście po Bożej prawicy, że pokornie ufając Bogu i opierając się o Niego, On sam będzie nas strzegł i nieustannie ukazywał nam ścieżkę życia pośród tylu innych, prowadzących ku śmierci.





Who Am I To Judge? Part 2 Responding to Relativism with Love and Logic

The eighteen parishioners who participated in our fall Adult Study Program, "Who Am I to Judge?" shared some of the insights they gained about Relativism vs. Truth.

Comments from the Teen and Adult Participants include:

- In a relativistic world that says, "Be yourself," people use that as an excuse to sin. God wants us to live a life of virtue and be more like He created us to be. We will be happier when we're virtuous.
- God's laws provide boundaries for living according to our human dignity. Relativism has no universal boundaries, but everyone makes up their own rules, becoming their own god.
- The moral law is written by God to help us grow in love. Relativism wounds people.
- Relativism claims that your choices don't matter to others; but they really do.
- This course taught me the importance of using my voice to spread God's teachings, which will bring more happiness to others in this morally confused society.
- To love is to will the good of the other. When someone is disagreeing with some eternal truth, and I know that their erroneous belief is not in their best interest. It is my duty, if I love them, to teach them the truth kindly without being offensive or defensive.
- I learned how to frame my discussion points in the context of love and care for the person. You don't have to compromise conviction to be compassionate.
- Since God has written his laws on the human heart, a person who disregards God suffers from cognitive dissonance; their sinful actions are not matching their beliefs, so instead of giving up the sin, they try to change their beliefs. Telling them of God's mercy can help them overcome this.
- It is NOT loving to refrain from telling someone that their life choice will hurt them. The Spiritual Works of Mercy include, "Admonish the sinner, Instruct the ignorant, and Council the doubtful."
- Catholics have the Truth from God. We should be courageous about declaring it. Relativism has never been proven an effective solution to life's dilemmas.
- Relativism is not morally neutral; it is an imposition of godlessness on society.
- The motto for relativism is "I did it my way." Jesus said, "Follow me."






