

From the desk of Father Koys Dear Parishioners,

I don't think Jesus would have made a good accountant. When the poor widow puts in a few pennies into the collection box, Jesus declares that she has put in more than all the rest. Clearly, Jesus isn't a CPA. Jesus, of course is seeing

something in the woman's heart that he doesn't see in the others. I think we call it the "I'm all in" attitude.

Today, let's all consider just what you and I are "all in" for. The gospel highlights the fact that giving a lot when we can't afford to give a lot, takes lots of faith. Today, many people find it difficult to trust the church when it comes to donations. Inside the church, like inside D.C., there are significant divisions. In many parishes during October and November reports on the financial situation of the parish are being given. We will have ours soon. This is a good time to pray about our financial "all in" as well as our "Catholic all in." One thing to consider when considering our financial gifts to the church is perhaps best seen when we compare our expenses. In many finance planning apps or programs, there is a category called "expendable income". That is usually the money you have left over after you pay all the necessary bills. Mortgage: check. Insurance: check. Food bill: check. Then you see how much you have for vacations, sports, eating at nice restaurants, etc. Here is where Jesus' CPA wisdom comes in. He wants us all to be "all in" when it comes to our faith. Let's consider a new definition of CPA. Let's think of Our Lord's wisdom as Catholic Percentage Amount. The two poor widows in our readings were "all in". It's a good thing they didn't have husbands, because no man worth his salt would have let his wife put everything they had to live on in the collection box. But they did and Jesus approved.

As a priest, whose duty it is to pay the bills of our church, I can't ask you to put everything you have to live on in the basket. Everyone would be poor after giving everything so the basket would be quite empty going forward. Kind of like those who think making the wealthy pay "their fair share" will improve the economy. This issue has been around forever. And the church has forever encouraged something called tithing. Unfortunately, very few Catholics actually tithe. Many Protestant pastors actually ask their congregants to show the parish office their tax returns. I have always been uncomfortable with that approach. Since the 10% amount goes all the way back to Old Testament times, when there was no Social Security, no Welfare, no Government assistant programs, I am a proponent of the sliding percentage approach. Just having some percentage amount shifts one's gifts to the church from the "expendable income" category to the necessities of life. Can you give 7%? 5% or even 2%? Imagine what the church could do if even this kind of tithing were popular. Even if you don't like to figure percentages, could you give the cost of one nice dinner, or one professional sporting event or play, or new outfit you don't really need?

Lastly, but most importantly, when it comes to

being "all in" with the Catholic church we all need to consider whether we are "cafeteria Catholics" or we are faithful believers who believe all that the Church teaches. In this regard, it doesn't matter if you tithe to 35%. If we're not "all in" we maybe building an organization to ourselves and not for God's glory.






We extend an invitation to those in our Lemont Catholic Family who feel that the Celebration of Anointing will provide help for them in sickness and aging of their bodies.

In the past, the anointing was done near the time of death. Theology today understands anointing as the Sacrament of the Sick rather than at the time of approaching death. The Anointing of the Sick is the prayer of Christ and His Church for the physical and spiritual health of the sick person.

Who may be anointed?

- A sick person may be anointed before he/she undergoes surgery, whether or not the surgery is serious.
- * Persons with chronic illness.
- Older persons, even if they are not suffering from dangerous illness.
- Mentally disabled persons and chemically dependent persons.
- * A sick child may be anointed in order to be comforted and uplifted by the Sacrament.

Z biurka wikariusza pastora Drodzy Parafianie,

Nie sądzę, żeby Jezus mógłby być dobrym księgowym mając na myśli wdowę z dzisiejszego czytania. Gdy biedna wdowa wrzuca kilka groszy do skarbony, Jezus ogłasza, że dała więcej niż wszyscy pozostali. Oczywiście, Jezus nie jest licencjonowanym księgowym. Jezus widzi w sercu tej kobiety coś,

czego nie dostrzega u innych. Myślę, że możemy to nazwać postawą "jestem w pełni zaangażowana". Dzisiaj zastanówmy się, w co ty i ja jesteśmy "w pełni zaangażowani". Ewangelia podkreśla fakt, że dawanie dużo, kiedy nie możemy sobie na to pozwolić, wymaga wielkiej wiary. Obecnie wielu ludziom trudno jest ufać Kościołowi, jeśli chodzi o darowizny. W Kościele, podobnie jak w Waszyngtonie, są znaczne podziały. W wielu parafiach w październiku i w listopadzie przedstawiane są raporty o sytuacji finansowej parafii. Nasz raport będzie wkrótce udosptępniony. To dobry czas, aby pomodlić się o nasze finansowe "w pełni zaangażowanie", a także o nasze "katolickie zaangażowanie".

Jedną z rzeczy, które warto rozważyć, myśląc o naszych darowiznach na rzecz Kościoła, jest porównanie naszych wydatków. W wielu aplikacjach lub programach do planowania finansowego jest kategoria zwana "dochód do dyspozycji". To zazwyczaj pieniądze, które zostają po opłaceniu wszystkich koniecznych rachunków takich jak: kredyt hipoteczny, ubezpieczenie, czy rachunki spożywcze. Następnie jest nam pokazane ile pozostaje na wakacje, sport, restauracje, spotkania towarzyskie, itp. I tu właśnie wchodzi mądrość księgowego Jezusa. On chce, abyśmy wszyscy byli "w pełni zaangażowani" w naszą wiarę. Rozważmy nową definicję księgowego. Pomyślmy o mądrości Naszego Pana jako Katolicki Procentowy Udział. Dwie biedne wdowy z naszych czytań były "w pełni zaangażowane". Dobrze, że nie miały mężów, bo żaden rozsądny mężczyzna nie pozwoliłby swojej żonie oddać wszystkiego co mieli na życie, do skarbony. Ale one to zrobiły, a Jezus to pochwalił.

Jako kapłan, którego obowiązkiem jest opłacanie rachunków naszej parafii, nie mogę prosić Was o to, abyście oddali wszystko co macie na życie do koszyka. Bylibyśmy biedni po oddaniu wszystkiego, a koszyk niestety pozostałby pusty w przyszłości. Podobnie jak ci, którzy myślą, że sprawienie, by bogaci płacili "swoją sprawiedliwą część", poprawi gospodarkę. Ten problem istnieje od zawsze. I od zawsze Kościół zachęcał do czegoś, co nazywa się dziesięciną. Niestety, bardzo niewielu katolików faktycznie oddaje dziesięcinę. Wiele protestanckich pastorów faktycznie prosi swoich wiernych o przedstawienie deklaracji podatkowych w biurze parafialnym. Zawsze czułem się nieswojo z takim podejściem. Ponieważ kwota 10% sięga czasów Starego Testamentu, kiedy nie było ZUS-u, pomocy społecznej ani programów rządowych, jestem zwolennikiem podejścia z elastycznym procentem. Samo posiadanie jakiegoś procentowego udziału przenosi darowizny na rzecz Kościoła z kategorii "dochód do dyspozycji" do kategorii konieczności życiowych. Czy jesteś w stanie ofiarować 7%, 5% albo nawet 2%? Wyobraź sobie, co Kościół mógłby zrobić, gdyby nawet taki rodzaj dziesięciny był popularny. Nawet jeśli nie lubisz liczyć procentów, czy mógłbyś

oddać równowartość jednego obiadu, jednego profesjonalnego wydarzenia sportowego, przedstawienia teatralnego czy nowego stroju, którego tak naprawdę nie potrzebujesz?

Na koniec, co najważniejsze, jeśli chodzi o "pełne zaangażowanie" w Kościół katolicki, wszyscy musimy zastanowić się, czy jesteśmy "katolikami wybiórczymi", czy też wiernymi wierzącymi, którzy przyjmują wszystko, czego naucza Kościół. Pod tym względem nie ma znaczenia, czy oddajesz dziesięcinę w wysokości 35%. Jeśli nie jesteśmy "w pełni zaangażowani", być może budujemy organizację dla siebie, a nie na chwałę Boga.





Learning to Respond to Relativism, Part 1

This fall, eighteen parishioners participated in our Adult Study Program, "Who Am I to Judge?" We gathered on Monday evenings, used the FORMED platform for the eight video lessons and used the accompanying workbooks. We learned quite a bit and gained a lot of love and courage.

Some of the Concepts We Learned:

Relativism is a belief system that claims that there is no right and wrong, and ultimately no objective moral truth.

Relativism says, "This commandment or moral truth is ok for some people, but not for others." Everything is 'relative' according to the situation.

Relativism is the opposite of Catholicism.

Catholicism, and all of Christianity believes that Jesus is The Way, the Truth and the Life, and we cannot make up our own morality. When we make choices that are against God's law, we harm ourselves and society.

Relativism makes excuses and justifies sins, disregarding God and His covenant with His people.

Catholicism believes that Jesus forgives our sins, and instead of making excuses for our sins, we humbly turn to God and repent, asking for His mercy in the confessional.

People who believe in relativism may deny or reject God's mercy, or maybe they don't understand it.

How to Respond to Relativism:

- Catholics need to push back politely and be able to stand up for our beliefs, God's Truth.
- We need to invite others to see as God sees and to know his unconditional mercy and love.
- We learned the difference between making a judgment and judging someone's soul.
- "I can disagree with you and still respect your freedom."



- Respect but do not repel. People who are relativistic often get defensive when presented with the truth. Don't drive them away from God but be a good example of kindness. "I respect you, but do not agree with your way of thinking, I see it as harmful."
- Disagreement is not 'hate'. When we temper our words with mercy, it can come across as love.
- Why should we challenge relativism? Because the people who follow relativism will not ultimately be happy in this life or the next.
