#### From the desk of Father Koys Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow marks the beginning of a new administration in D.C. Whether you voted for him or not, I believe a few comments are in order from a Catholic perspective. First,

Catholicism has always encouraged active and faithful participation in the public square where policies and laws are created that influence and control the lives of all people. We should feel the obligation to let our love of God guide the love we have for our country. It's too easy to let our faith be something strictly personal, something we just take care of on a Sunday morning. It's also quite understandable to feel apathetic about what those put in office by the electoral process say and do with the authority they possess. So, the first thing all of us believers should commit to is to pray that officials exercise their authority with a strong sense that any authority they have comes to them from above. The words of Jesus before Pilate are just as true today as when first uttered. So let us pray that everyone from President Trump down to the newest "dog catcher" consider the counsel of faithful religious people around them. We should recall the words of John Adams, the second president, who said, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other.'

There are a number of people who have fought against the Trump campaign, often sighting his checkered moral past. Top of their list are those examples of "womanizing" or "philandering" of the past. Only God knows the accuracy of all the accusations we've been made aware, but suffice it to say, few are saying he's without any sin. Lest such an awareness of such a checkered past cause a deeper sense of apathy in one's patriotic soul; I believe God would have us pray for him and his continual conversion. There is something strange or out of the ordinary about a man whose track record of marriages and relationships is less than stellar who has worked so hard at renewing the deep respect for God's gift of life by promoting prolife policies and personnel as well as biblical marriage. There is a natural tendency for people who have failed in this

area of life to support more liberal pro-abortion policies. The new President's pro-life efforts are there for the viewing. The heated opposition to his campaign by those committed to abortion rights shows the world he is not following the normal course of a philanderer. There is good reason to believe he can continue the road of conversion and a deeper walk with the Lord. Other political figures whose Christian credentials were much more prominent often compromise the Catholic teaching about respect for life of the unborn and use their authority to maintain abortion rights. Let's pray this week, not just for this new President, but for a renewal of the sense of "Christendom" for our country. I pray too, if I am right about his sense of conversion that he will inspire other folks with "checkered moral histories" to a deeper conversion to Christ.



Proceeds support charitable works of the Lemont Knights of Columbus, particularly in the Lemont community.






#### Second Collection-January 25th & 26th Church in Latin America

#### Z biurka wikariusza pastora Drodzy Parafianie,

Jutro rozpoczyna urzędować nowa administracja w Waszyngtonie. Niezależnie od tego, czy głosowałeś/aś na obecnego prezydenta, czy nie, uważam, że kilka uwag z katolickiej

perspektywy jest wskazane. Po pierwsze, katolicyzm zawsze zachęcał do aktywnego i wiernego uczestnictwa w życiu publicznym, gdzie tworzone są prawa wpływające na życie wszystkich ludzi. Powinniśmy czuć się zobowiązani, aby nasza miłość do Boga kierowała miłością, jaką darzymy nasz kraj. Z łatwością możemy sobie pozwolić na to, aby nasza wiara stała się czymś ściśle prywatnym, czymś, czym zajmujemy się jedynie w niedzielny poranek.

Zrozumiałe jest również, że można czuć apatię wobec tego, co osoby wybrane w procesie wyborczym mówią i robią z władzą, którą posiadają. Dlatego pierwszą rzeczą, do której wszyscy wierzący powinni się zobowiązać, jest modlitwa za urzędnicków, aby wykonywali swoją władzę z głębokim przekonaniem, że każda władza, jaką mają, pochodzi z góry. Słowa Jezusa przed Piłatem są dziś tak samo prawdziwe, jak kiedyś, gdy zostały wypowiedziane. Módlmy się zatem, aby wszyscy, od prezydenta Trumpa po przeciętnego "zjadacza chleba" brali pod uwagę rady ludzi religijnych wokół siebie.

Powinniśmy przypomnieć sobie słowa Johna Adams, drugiego prezydenta Stanów, który powiedział: "Ten rząd został stworzony wyłącznie dla ludzi religijnych i moralnych. Bez nich nie przetrwa." Jest wiele osób, które walczyły przeciwko kampanii Trumpa, często przywołując jego burzliwą moralną przeszłość. Na szczycie listy zarzutów znajdują się przykłady "kobietoznawstwa" lub "niewierności" z przeszłości. Tylko Bóg zna dokładność wszystkich oskarżeń, o których słyszeliśmy, ale wystarczy powiedzieć, że niewiele osób twierdzi, iż jest on bez grzechu.

Niech świadomość tej burzliwej przeszłości nie powoduje głębszego poczucia apatii w patriotycznej duszy. Wierzę, że Bóg chce, abyśmy modlili się za niego i za jego nawrócenie. Jest coś niezwykłego w człowieku, którego historia małżeństw i relacji jest daleka od ideału, a który tak ciężko pracował nad odnowieniem głębokiego szacunku dla Bożego daru życia poprzez promowanie bardziej liberalnej polityki pro-life i biblijnego małżeństwa. Istnieje naturalna tendencja u ludzi, którzy zawiedli w tej dziedzinie życia, do wspierania bardziej liberalnych polityk proaborcyjnych.

Wysiłki pro-life nowego prezydenta są widoczne. Gorący sprzeciw wobec jego kampanii ze strony tych, którzy popierają prawa do aborcji, pokazuje światu, że nie podąża on zwykłą drogą osoby o podobnej przeszłości. Istnieje dobry powód, by wierzyć, że może kontynuować drogę nawrócenia i głębszej więzi z Panem. Inne postacie polityczne, których chrześcijańskie kwalifikacje były znacznie bardziej widoczne, często kompromitowały nauczanie Kościoła katolickiego o szacunku dla życia nienarodzonych, wykorzystując swoją władzę do utrzymania prawa do aborcji.

Módlmy się w tym tygodniu nie tylko za nowego prezydenta, ale także za odnowienie poczucia "chrześcijaństwa" w naszym kraju. Modlę się również, aby, jeśli mam rację co do jego nawrócenia, zainspirował on innych ludzi z "burzliwą przeszłością moralną" do głębszego nawrócenia ku Chrystusowi.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

OF THE UNBORN Since the 1973 decisions of Roe

v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

And while, on June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to preborn children. So, great prayer and advocacy is still very needed.

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

## We are in a Jubilee Year! What Does that Mean for Me?

The Year 2025 is declared by the Church as a Jubilee Year of Hope. On December 25, Pope Francis opened the Jubilee Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, called "The Holy Door," to begin an international 'Year of Hope" in this world full of violence and confusion. The faithful are called to pray, study, and make pilgrimages of hope, and will receive more graces than ever for our efforts. The Year of Jubilee will continue until next January 6, 2026.

During each month of this Jubilee Year, one or more Jubilees dedicated to different groups will be celebrated in Rome. In January, for example, there is the Jubilee of the World of Communications, in February the Jubilee of Artists, in April the Jubilee of Teenagers, etc.

A Jubilee is one of the most significant events of the Catholic Church that occurs only about every 25 years. A Jubilee year, declared by the Holy Father, offers the faithful an opportunity for transformation in holiness through additional graces that can help us reach heaven.

Why? Because it makes available to the faithful all the easy means to obtain benefits from the 'treasury' of the Church, for example, a plenary indulgence, which returns the soul to the sinless state it was in when it received Baptism. A Jubilee year should be a time of spiritual renewal for all Catholics. "Now the time has come for a new Jubilee, when once more the Holy Door will be flung open to invite

How does a plenary indulgence work? In the Sacrament of Penance sins are forgiven. However, the temporal punishment required by divine justice remains. The indulgence grants remission of all temporal punishment in purgatory, so that if a person dies after receiving this gift, he or she goes directly to heaven.

There are specific actions and conditions required for receiving this indulgence, including being in the state of grace, taking a pilgrimage to a Jubilee site, and saying certain prayers. We will explore the conditions for receiving these graces and indulgences in a future article.

What should we do first to enter into this Jubilee Year of Hope? Deepen your understanding of HOPE. A good way to do this is to **read or reread and pray over the Encyclical** *Spe Salvi (Saved in Hope)* written by Pope Benedict XVI. It is available free in any language at Vatican.va.
