This time of year, many young people take the plunge. No, not an ice bath. It's the time proposals are made and plans set in motion for a wedding. I share an article

from the Couple to Couple League, a Catholic organization dedicated to strengthening marriages and families, and hence society at large. More and more Catholic young people have lost the connection between the human love of husband and wife and the nature of God's sacramental grace which is divine love. For anyone who doesn't see marriage as a sacrament, this mediation may change their minds. If marriage is not a sacrament, then God is a fool. Deacon Turrentine asks...


"Do you "fall in love"? Or do you choose to love? Is love passive or active? Our original experience of love is passive. We first receive love, from our parents, other people, from God. Love evokes love. In its full development, love is not only active but life giving. We choose to love even when sacrifice is required and our sacrificial love helps others learn to love. Love is receptive. Love is active. Learning how to blend these two principles to combine them in a fruitful unity, is essential to marriage as it has been designed by God. A couple tries to weave their lives together, giving and receiving to create their own story of "two becoming one". Their unique story is truly a love story insofar as it is written in the context of God's redemptive story. God is the ultimate mystery of love. It reflects both the sacrificial love of Jesus for his Church and the fruitful love of the Trinity. Marriage is intended by God to unite man and woman and to give life. The unshakable unity of this love creates the right conditions to bring forth children and educate them in love. And children expand and deepen the unity of the parents who truly become one flesh in each of their offspring.

The challenging and ennobling mysteries of real love are obscured by the sadly impoverished view of sex and marriage prevalent in our society, which is focused on getting rather than giving, on pleasure rather than sacrificial love. So many couples have never heard a compelling presentation of the beauty of God's plan for marriage. Christians should know that God intends marriage and family to be a school of love, a sacred community in which we constantly receive and grow in love and learn to share it with others."



Bless Your Home on Epiphany (January 5, 2025) 20+C+M+B+25

The blessing of homes, using specially blessed chalk, is a popular Epiphany custom. The chalk is blessed at Mass and then taken home by families where the senior member of the household leads the blessing.

Chalk, a product of clay, symbolic of the human nature of Jesus, is used to make the inscription which reminds us that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our home.

The upper horizontal piece of the door frame of the front entrance to the home is inscribed with the Cross of Salvation, together with the indication of the year and the initials of the Three Wise Men. Their names were established in the eighth century and are traditionally remembered as Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, although these names are not found in Scripture. The inscription also stands for Chistus Monsionem Benedict, which means "Christ, Bless this Home".

The popular form of the inscription is: 20+C+M+B+25

As the inscription is being made on the doorway the following prayer can be said:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. **Amen.**

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it.

Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

Loving God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and abiding in your will. We ask this through Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

Our school is extremely grateful for their support! We are more than two-thirds of the way to achieving our goal!




A Note From Our Pastor

The Church teaches that receiving Holy Communion is not a private action but a communal one, as the very word "communion" implies. For that reason the norm established by Holy See for the universal Church and approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is for the faithful to process together as an expression of their coming forward

as the Body of Christ and to receive Holy Communion standing. Processions are an ancient practice of the Church and have been part of the liturgy from the earliest days, assisting the faithful to always keep in mind that we are a pilgrim people, making our way together to the fulness of the heavenly banquet Christ has prepared for us. We process into the church. We process up to bring the gifts. We process to receive Holy Communion. We process out to carry the Lord into the world.

Nothing should be done to impede this sacred ritual of receiving communion or diminish its powerful symbol by disrupting an important moment in which the faithful, in processing together, express their faith that they are called to become the very Body of Christ they receive. Certainly reverence can and should be expressed by bowing before the reception of Holy Communion, but no one should engage in a gesture that calls attention to oneself or disrupts the flow of the procession by assuming another posture. That would be contrary to the norms and tradition of the church, which all the faithful are urged to respect and observe.

O tej porze roku wielu młodych ludzi podejmuje ważny krok. To czas, kiedy pary się zaręczają, a plany dotyczące ślubu nabierają realnych kształtów. Pragnę podzielić się artykułem

pochodzącym z katolickiej organizacji o nazwie Couple to Couple League, której celem jest umacnianie małżeństw i rodzin, a tym samym całego społeczeństwa. Coraz więcej młodych katolików zatraciło związek między ludzką miłością męża i żony a naturą sakramentalnej łaski Boga, która jest miłością boską. Dla tych, którzy nie postrzegają małżeństwa jako sakramentu, ta refleksja może zmienić ich zdanie. Jeśli małżeństwo nie jest sakramentem, to Bóg jest głupcem. Diakon Turrentine stawia pytanie...

"Czy "zakochujemy się"? Czy też wybieramy miłość? Czy miłość jest bierna czy aktywna? Nasze pierwsze doświadczenie miłości jest bierne. Najpierw otrzymujemy miłość – od rodziców, od innych ludzi i od Boga. Miłość rodzi miłość. W swoim pełnym rozwoju miłość jest nie tylko aktywna, ale także dająca życie. Wybieramy miłość nawet wtedy, gdy wymaga ona poświęcenia, a nasza ofiarna miłość pomaga innym uczyć się kochać. Miłość jest chłonna. Miłość jest rónież aktywna. *Umiejętność połączenia tych dwóch zasad w owocna* jedność jest kluczowa dla małżeństwa, jakie zaprojektował Bóg. Małżonkowie starają się splatać swoje życie, wzajemnie uzupełniając się, by stworzyć własną historię "dwojga stających się jednym". Ich wyjątkowa historia jest prawdziwą historią miłosną, o ile wpisana jest w kontekst odkupieńczej historii Boga. Bóg jest ostateczną tajemnicą miłości. Małżeństwo odzwierciedla zarówno ofiarną miłość Jezusa do Jego Kościoła, jak i owocną miłość Trójcy Świętej. Małżeństwo zostało przez Boga zamierzone jako jedność mężczyzny i kobiety oraz jako źródło życia. Niezachwiana jedność tej miłości stwarza właściwe warunki do wydawania na świat dzieci oraz wychowywania ich w miłości. Dzieci z kolei poszerzają i pogłębiają jedność rodziców, którzy

naprawdę stają się jednym ciałem w każdym ze swoich potomków.

Wyzwania i wzniosłe tajemnice prawdziwej miłości są przysłonięte przez smutno zubożoną wizję seksu i małżeństwa dominującą w naszym społeczeństwie, które koncentruje się na braniu zamiast dawaniu, na przyjemności zamiast na miłości ofiarnej. Tak wiele par nigdy nie usłyszało przekonującej prezentacji piękna Bożego planu dla małżeństwa. Chrześcijanie powinni wiedzieć, że Bóg zamierzył małżeństwo i rodzinę jako szkołę miłości, świętą wspólnotę, w której nieustannie otrzymujemy miłość, wzrastamy w niej i uczymy się dzielić nią z innymi."

Do you know someone who has lost their faith?
